

Mr Jim Jasper- signalling and shelling

“...I was a signaller so I used to have to go around and repair the lines, take telephone lines out to standing patrols, and things like that. We had about 32 killed I think in total, in Korea.

...[The shelling] was bad. You had to keep undercover. I suppose, once you get into it, I suppose you get used to it really, but when you first go up there, you think... you don't know what's going to happen, it's all strange-like, you know. After two or three weeks you get a bit used to it. But most people, they weren't worried about getting killed as such, it was getting injured, badly injured, blinded or something like that. That was the main thing...”
